

As a perspective HMRU instructor candidate, you have selected to begin a process that will impart highly technical information to new and current firs t responders in the area of Hazardous Materials response.

While this process will challenge your ability and test your knowledge, it is designed to insure that candidates are knowledgeable in the subject, properly trained and are capable of delivering factual, timely and correct information to emergency responders.

INSTRUCTIONAL ACTIVITIES

As a TTT candidate, you are required to already have attended and completed the class as a student. As a TTT candidate, the expectation is that they know the program well. Train-the-trainers candidates are expected to come to class ready to teach the class they have applied for.

During this process, you will be evaluated as to your ability and your technical knowledge of the specific topic.

PRETEST

Each TTT candidate will be completing a pre-test in the usage of the 2008 DOT Emergency Response Guidebook in the first 30 minutes of the class. Individuals must pass this pre-test with 90 %. Pre-test is open book, which will be provided.

A list containing sample questions for your reference is attached.

POST TEST

Each TTT specific class will have a post test. Post test must be completed with 90% OR BETTER TO QUALIFY AS A HMRU INSTRUCTOR.

Examples of the questions that can be expected:

Questions are all based upon the 14 th Edition of the NJSP HMRU HazMat Awareness (Course # 06007) student reference guide, and the 2008 edition of the US DOT ERG.

Sample Question #1

The 2008 DOT ERG is broken down into how many major sections

- a. 4 sections
- b. 5 sections
- c. 3 sections
- d. 9 sections

Answer: 5 sections White, Yellow, Blue, Green and Orange

Sample Question #2

The NFPA 704 symbol utilizes 4 colored areas or fields. The RED field designates

- 1. Fire Hazard
- 2. Ignition Temperature
- 3. Combustibility
- 4. Reactivity

Answer: Fire Hazard

Sample Question #3

Duties of the Awareness trained responder includes:

- 1. Secure the scene, attempt ID, make notification
- 2. Call CHEMTREC, Call DEP-NJ, call the fire dept.
- 3. Call DEP-NJ, Call NJSP headquarters, call police
- 4. Eliminate ignition sources, dike drains, remove victims

Answer: Secure the scene, attempt ID, and make notification

Sample Question # 4

Hazardous Materials Awareness level training is:

- 1. Offensive
- 2. Defensive
- 3. Site specific
- 4. All are same

Answer: Defensive – OSHA 29 CFR 1910.120 (q) 6. No intentional contact with materials.

TRAIN-THE-TRAINER, APPLICANTS MUST SUBMIT A RESUME, AN HMRU TRAIN-THE-TRAINER REGISTRATION FORM, AND SUPPORTING CERTIFICATES AS LISTED.

There are five (5) catagories of Instructor specific to HMRU.

- 1. MASTER INSTRUCTOR
- 2. LEAD INSTRUCTOR
- 3. INSTRUCTOR
- 4. APPRENTICE INSTRUCTOR
- 5. GUEST

Definitions.

MASTER INSTRUCTOR is an individual who has over 10 years experience in the hazardous material response field. Has over 10 years experience in classroom instruction and or skill station experience. Individual is capable of performing in a lead instructor/Instructor role and supervise any areas of the training curriculum.

<u>LEAD INSTRUCTOR</u> is an individual who has 5-7 years experience in the hazardous material response field. Has 5-7 years experience in classroom instruction and or skill station experience. Individual is capable of performing in a specific topic as a lead instructor/Instructor role and may supervise the specific station or classroom topic.

<u>INSTRUCTOR</u> is an individual who has 3-5 years experience in the hazardous material response field. Has 3-5 years experience in classroom instruction and or skill station experience. Individual is utilized primarily in skill station capacity.

<u>APPRENTICE INSTRUCTOR</u> This is the entry level for instructor training and is an individual who has 2 years experience in the hazardous material response field. Has 2 years experience in classroom instruction with at least 40 hours classroom/skill station experience.

<u>GUEST INSTRUCTOR</u> is an individual that has highly specific knowledge and or experience in an area or topic addressing hazardous materials/WMD response issues.

- The following evaluation criteria for certification of hazardous materials instructors will be followed.
- Potential instructors will be evaluated in their area of subject matter expertise.
- Potential instructors will be required to demonstrate their skills and knowledge in the classroom and or skill station setting
- Periodic or follow-up evaluations or recertification requirements
- Prior hands-on experience in hazardous materials response
- Prior experience in performing the tasks being taught.

General

It is recommended that the individual delivering First Responder Programs demonstrate competency at least one level above the planned training program delivery.

"Job knowledge - thorough knowledge of the content to be taught; knowledge of how the information, techniques, and principles apply to performing the job; understanding the difficulties and problems that arise on the job; and specific training or education in the subject matter being taught.

"Job experience - actual work experience directly related to the subject matter (have performed the job being taught) and experience in hazardous materials response.

"Training knowledge - successful completion of an instructor training course that covers the principles of learning, methods and sequencing of instruction, methods of testing and evaluation, preparing performance objectives and lesson plans, training liability, and oral and written communication skills

"Personal qualities patience and understanding, enjoyment of and respect for students, and flexibility. "Sensitivity to cultural diversity among students.

- An instructor delivering a First Responder Awareness Program should be competent at the First Responder Operational level or above.
- ☐ The instructor should also be competent in adult instructional techniques.
- When selecting instructors for the technician and incident commander levels the material becomes increasingly more technical and decision oriented
- It is imperative that instructors have the job experience and presentation skills necessary to successfully deliver the selected program.
- ☐ Train the trainer programs provide the opportunity for existing instructors to become familiar with a program and instructional techniques associated with the program delivery.

HMRU Train-the-Trainer Applications

Individuals interested in becoming an Instructor in any of the NJSP HMRU Training programs will need to begin the process by completing the attached form.

ALL APPL ICATIONS MUST BE ACCOMPANIED BY COMPLETE DOCUMENTATION. THOSE APPLICATIONS WITH INCOMPLETE DOCUMENTATION WILL NOT BE REVIEWED.

Documentation (certificates etc) can be sent via e-mail (preferred) or via regular mail.

NJSP HMRU will confirm via E-mail receipt of your application and documentation.
